

Phoenix Leadership Experience Case Study



Objective:

Distribute content to leaders through mind, body, and soul.

Challenge:

Traditionally, leadership conferences are structured around ballroom sessions for content delivery, followed by evening receptions for networking. Our client wanted to break away from this formula and create a transformative experience that would not only engage attendees intellectually but also challenge them physically and emotionally. The goal was to design a leadership conference that transcended traditional learning and connected leaders on a deeper level—mind, body, and soul.

Solution:

To bring this vision to life, we sourced one of a kind venues that would serve as unique backdrops for this immersive experience outside of the ballroom. The first, **Arcosanti**, a prototype arcology, famous for its architecture with respect to ecology in the high desert of Arizona. Secondly, Fort McDowell, a 40-square mile reservation in the rugged Arizona desert. These locations complemented the conference's goal of breaking away from conventional spaces, providing an environment that encouraged reflection and connection.

We shifted the delivery of content away from the conventional ballroom and instead focused on diverse, immersive activities that challenged attendees physically, mentally, and emotionally.

- **Day 1:** Attendees rose early to hike through the scenic mountains in small groups, stimulating their minds while facing physical challenges. Yoga at sunrise in Arcosanti's iconic Vault allowed them to connect with themselves in a peaceful setting. Later, participants entered a custom built immersive dome structure with projection mapping and used just three adjectives to reintroduce themselves, fostering vulnerability and connection. In the afternoon, they gathered in an outdoor amphitheater to hear from each other, sharing perspectives in a refreshing, interactive environment.



- **Day 2:** The leadership journey continued with a customized Spartan-inspired race through the rugged terrain of the Phoenix desert at Fort McDowell. Working together, attendees faced physical challenges that pushed their limits, forging teamwork and resilience.



Outcome:

This approach completely transformed the traditional conference format. Instead of passively absorbing content, attendees engaged in a multi-sensory experience that pushed them outside of their comfort zones. They learned not just from speakers, but from their surroundings, their peers, and themselves.

Through these activities, participants overcame personal barriers, demonstrating leadership by helping others push through their limits. They reevaluated their relationship with discomfort and pain—embracing challenges rather than avoiding them. By the end of the conference, leaders were empowered to lead with a renewed sense of purpose, knowing their future was brighter than their past.
